Pickleball Rules

Overview

1. Games are played to 11 points and must be won by 2 points.

- The server's arm must be moving in an upward arc when the ball is struck.
- Paddle contact with the ball must not be made above the waist level.
- The head of the paddle must not be above the highest part of the wrist at contact.
- A 'drop serve' is also permitted in which case none of the elements above apply.
- The server's feet must be behind the baseline and not outside the imaginary extension of the sideline or centerline.
- Serves must land within the confines of the opposite diagonal court. Only one serve attempt is allowed.
- "Let" serves (ball hits net cord) are legal and should be played.
- A serve that land on the "kitchen" line is out; other lines are considered in.

2. Service return must bounce before it is struck. The serving team must also let the ball bounce.

- After that, play may include volleys.
- Balls in play that land on any court line are good.
- Players will call the lines on their side of the court.

3. A player cannot volley the ball while standing in the kitchen (non-volley zone).

- The non-volley zone (kitchen) is the court area within 7 feet of both sides of the net.
- A player may enter the kitchen to hit a ball if it bounces first.
- It is a fault if, when volleying a ball, the player steps on the non-volley zone, including the line and/or when the player's momentum causes them or anything they are wearing or carrying to touch the non-volley zone including the associated lines.
- It is a fault if, after volleying, a player is carried by momentum into or touches the non-volley zone, even if the volleyed ball is declared dead before this happens.

4. The game starting server alternates from right to left as long as points are won

- Points are scored only by serving team.
- Only on the opening serve of the game, when the server loses the point, the serve goes to the opposing team, always starting on the right side.
- This server is called server 1. When the point is lost, the serve transfers to their partner, server 2, who will continue to serve from the last position.
